Policy statement:	Laurentis Energy Partners (Laurentis) shall establish a supplier diversity program to support Indigenous businesses and artists.
Requirements:	<p>Laurentis is committed to sourcing and procuring goods and services from Indigenous suppliers where it makes practical business sense. This policy shall provide guidance to Laurentis’s employees who are collaborating with Indigenous people, communities, businesses, and projects across many facets of our business.</p> <p>Laurentis’s commitment:</p> <p>Laurentis shall commit to the following procurement priorities, where it makes practical business sense:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Procure goods and services and promote and participate in viable procurement opportunities with Indigenous suppliers. • Actively source and prioritize goods and services from Indigenous-owned businesses to increase supplier diversity at Laurentis. • Include screening criteria in the policy that prioritizes businesses with Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) or similar Indigenous relations programs. • Implement a mechanism within the competitive bid process for the evaluation of proposals and support the inclusion of Indigenous businesses in awarding contracts. • Enhance processes that identify Indigenous owned businesses within our approved supplier list to ensure inclusion in the Request for Proposals (RFP) of new business opportunities. <p>Leverage the Indigenous Relations Supplier Network (IRSN) to build relationships with the local Indigenous communities and businesses to identify opportunities and establish mentoring networks.</p>
